






British Values at St Philomena's CP School

	<p style="text-align: center;"><u>Democracy</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Children are involved in democratic processes e.g. voting for School Councillors and shared rewards.• The School Council visit City Hall every year to explore the work of the democratically elected Mayor of London.• We focus on events occurring in society (e.g. general elections, referenda) and maximise on the learning opportunities presented.• One of our governors is a local councillor who meets with the School Council to discuss current issues for the school and the local authority.
	<p style="text-align: center;"><u>The rule of law</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• We have a clearly structured behaviour policy which all stakeholders understand and follow• Children are taught to distinguish between right and wrong.• All incidents are investigated thoroughly, with the opinions of all parties listened to and all children treated equally.• Pupils discuss and develop their own set of classroom rules.
	<p style="text-align: center;"><u>Individual Liberty</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Many children have key roles and responsibilities in school such as prefects, monitors and playground helpers.• Within school children are actively encouraged to make choices, knowing they are in a safe and supportive environment.• Through our extra-curricular clubs and opportunities, children are given the freedom to make choices.• We aim to educate our children to make reasoned decisions about their work and behaviour; challenging themselves at all times to do the best they can.
	<p style="text-align: center;"><u>Mutual Respect</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Good manners embody mutual respect and pupils are expected to treat others as they would like to be treated at all times.• Our school has a very inclusive ethos of which we are very proud.• We educate our children to acquire an understanding of, and respect for their own way of life and those belonging to other cultures too.
