You may (or may not be !) curious to know what we did on our INSET days last week..

On Tuesday ALL staff and some of our governors received updated Safeguarding training. Regular input on the significant role school staff have in ensuring children are kept safe is crucial. Staff were reminded of the many threats to child safety, how to recognise the signs of abuse and/or neglect and ensuring that our process for reporting concerns are understood by all staff.

On Wednesday, we were joined with the teachers from the other schools in the Bromley Trust (St James', St Mary's, Holy Innocents, St Vincent's and St Peter and St Paul) and listened to two invited speakers.

Both speakers were inspirational and provided us with so much to reflect on and consider in our provision for our young people. We learned a great deal.

## Breaktime Snacks

The school understands that healthy snacks can be an important part of the diet of young people and can contribute positively towards a balanced diet. All children are allowed to bring in a healthy snack or their own piece of fruit to eat at morning break time (Fruit Winders and similar items are not allowed).

EYFS and KS1 Children are provided with free fruit to have at morning play. Unfortunately this week, we have seen some inappropriate snacks at morning play. Including biscuits, chocolate bars, bags of crisps and a sausage roll. **These are not permitted.** 

Please ensure you continue to provide an appropriate healthy snack for your child, should they want one. Your support is appreciated.

During the week beginning Monday 15<sup>th</sup> October, children will be bringing you to their classes after school to show you their class, displays and the work in their books.

Class teachers will not be available, it's all very informal and a lovely chance for the children to talk about their learning. Parents and carers have fed back very positively about how open classroom assists the conversation with teachers at the subsequent parent/teacher meetings.
