BROMLEY WELL YOUNG CARERS

A young carer is someone aged 25 and under who cares for a friend or family member who, due to illness, disability, a mental health problem or an addiction, cannot cope without their support

What might a young carer do?

- * Practical tasks, like cooking, housework and shopping.
- * Physical care, such as helping someone out of bed.
 - * Emotional support, including talking to someone who is distressed.
 - * Personal care, such as helping someone dress.
 - * Managing the family budget and collecting prescriptions.
 - * Helping to give medicine.
 - * Helping someone communicate.
 - * Looking after brothers and sisters

Being a young carer can have a big impact on the things that are important to growing up

- Young carers are already likely to have significantly lower educational attainment than their peers.
- * With the added complications of COVID-19, young carers have missed out on even more school than before and urgent support is needed if they are not to be left behind their peers.
- * Caring can also be an isolating experience but having the right support in place can give young carers a better chance of succeeding in all parts of their lives.

THE RESPONSIBILITIES OF YOUNG CARERS CAN VARY GREATLY, SO YOUR CHILD MAY BE ELIGIBLE FOR SUPPORT, EVEN IF YOU FEEL LIKE THEY DON'T DO A LOT OF CARING. IF YOU THINK YOU MIGHT KNOW A YOUNG CARER PLEASE CONTACT:

URGENT: Responsive Polio Vaccination for Children Aged 1 to 9 in London. We have been asked by the School Nurses to share this important information with you:

In response to the alarming findings of the poliovirus in sewage in London boroughs, the Committee on Vaccination **Immunisation** (JCVI) have instructed children aged 1 to 9 in London to urgently get a booster dose to ensure their children are fully protected. We have not seen a live case of polio in the UK since 1984, and it is vital that we prevent any community spread which could result in life-long paralysis and other disabilities, and in some cases, even There is no death. cure for polio, immunisation is the only protection. We are asking for the school's support in this drive to protect children by helping the NHS to raise awareness of the polio booster and directing parents and guardians at your school to take The NHS have been contacting parents to arrange a booster vaccination at local GP practices, however, due to the urgency of the situation, we have also stood additional vaccine up centres and pharmacies to aid in the delivery of the vaccine.

Call to action:

- Visit nhs.uk/polio-sites to find local vaccination centres and pharmacies providing vaccination. Many offer walk-in services (no appointment necessary), and at others you can book online or by phone
- Visit <u>www.bromley.gov.uk</u> for local services and information
- Check your child's health record (red book) to see if they are up to date on all their immunisations
