### MINOR CHANGE TO UNIFORM POLICY

### **School Uniform Reminder**

During this period of cold weather, we are more than happy for boys to wear jogging bottoms OVER their school shorts. These are to be removed once indoors. Please ensure that all boys have school shorts on underneath in line with our Uniform Policy. Thank you.

### **Secondary Drowning or Dry Drowning**

We have recently had a First Aid Refresher for all staff and was advised to inform parents of the following about "Secondary Drowning or Dry Drowning" which can occur from the swimming pool or the beach. Though rare, secondary drowning can be fatal if warning symptoms are ignored

Secondary drowning, or dry drowning, can be alarming for many parents. The term refers to delayed symptoms caused by inhaling water into the lungs while in water

When a child inhales even a small amount of water into their airways, it may cause inflammation and irritation in the lungs, making breathing difficult. The body sometimes initiates a chemical cascade in response to this injury, which worsens the lung membrane and can cause cardiac arrest or death.

### What are signs and symptoms of secondary

### drowning?

Secondary drowning may cause the vocal cords to spasm and the airway to close, resulting in choking. Symptoms can develop over minutes to hours after swimming, though it is guite rare.

Symptoms of secondary drowning include:

- Persistent coughing
- Labored breathing
- Chest pain
- Extreme fatigue, exhaustion, or lethargy
- Vomiting
- Fever
- Irritability or mood changes
- Difficulty talking
- Confusion or disorientation

### What are risk factors for secondary drowning?

Keep a close eye on the child for about 24 hours following a close call in the water.

If you are concerned, take your child to hospital where oxygen can be administered and fluid removed from the lungs.


**OVERALL ATTENDANCE FOR THE WEEK 97.8%**
