Year 6 Trip to RAF Museum

On Wednesday, we had the opportunity to visit the RAF Museum as part of our World War II topic, specifically focusing on the crucial role the Royal Air Force played during the Battle of Britain. This enriching experience allowed pupils to engage with a variety of historical artefacts, including uniforms and flight clothing, providing insight into the lives of the brave individuals who served. Through hands-on exploration, students learned about various heroes of the Battle of Britain and their significant contributions to the war effort. Following this. the children created presentations to share the stories of these war heroes. This engaging activity encouraged them to delve deeper into the diverse roles undertaken by both men and women in the RAF, highlighting how they helped protect Britain from invasion. The trip was not only educational but also inspirational, giving everyone a greater appreciation for the courage and sacrifice shown during this crucial time in history.

Last week, we observed Child Mental Health Week with a series of engaging activities across the school, inspired by the *Inside Out* movie. These activities encouraged children to reflect not only on their emotions but also on the importance of positive relationships, self-care, and resilience. Through discussions and creative exercises, children developed a deeper understanding of how mental well-being influences their actions and interactions with others. We hope these experiences have helped nurture a positive mindset, promoting emotional expression, healthy relationships, and strategies for managing challenges. Year 3 and Year 5 came together to explore positive self-image, drawing inspiration from the movie Inside Out. The children designed their own personality islands, representing different aspects of themselves and reflecting on what makes them unique.


PTA INFO
