The workshop is designed to teach the children about the benefits of using natural materials in design, and will provide them with an opportunity to work with willow, a versatile and sustainable material. Willow is a fast-growing plant that is easy to cultivate and harvest, making it an excellent choice for environmentally friendly projects. Not only will the children have a chance to learn about the practical aspects of working with willow, but they will also be able to appreciate its natural beauty.

The workshop will support children to create a memorial sculpture to honour Mrs. Meaney's memory. We hope that this will be a beautiful way to remember her and the legacy she has left behind. Lent


This Lent St Philomena's are supporting The Catholic Children's Society. We will also be thinking about how we can connect with children and families who need our help.
