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# **Incident on Chelsfield Rd**

I wish to express my gratitude to all our parents and carers for responding so positively to our instructions following the very sad accident outside school on Wednesday. We had to make some very quick decisions due to the timing of the incident, the landing of the helicopter on our playground and communication from police on the scene.

We managed to get all children off site in good time preventing them from witnessing anything and preserving the privacy and dignity of the injured lady. Thank you also to our school staff team for pulling together brilliantly. The injured lady remains in our prayers.

### Danger on Chelsfield Rd

Sadly, this incident highlights the danger of the speed of some vehicles outside our school. You may remember that one of our children was injured in a similar way last year. Not as seriously but we dread to think what could have happened...

I know that many parents and carers have communicated extensively with the Local Authority. One of our parent governors, Karis Procter, has also written to Bromley in order to stress our concerns for the safety of our children, families and the wider community. When we visited the Houses of Parliament, we invited our local MP, Gareth Bacon, to visit school. Please be assured, this subject will be brought to his attention, again, by our School Council should he take up our invitation. In the meantime I would urge as many of you as possible to lobby the local authority and Gareth Bacon to bring about some positive change.


We are delighted to share that our Year 3 teacher, Ms Molineaux, is expecting a baby boy in June! Many congratulations to her and her partner Kevin.
