
Songs of Praise

Norovirus

Cases of norovirus are on the rise generally. It can spread through schools where children have close contact very easily.

Therefore, if your child has Norovirus, please adhere to NHS advice and do not bring your child into school until 48 hours after the symptoms have stopped (sickness and/or diarrhoea).

Norovirus (or the vomiting bug/stomach bug) for most is a short lived illness with a full recovery within 2 to 3 days.

Good hand hygiene is really important to stop this illness spreading — that means children should wash their hands frequently and thoroughly with soap and warm water.

It is important that you drink plenty of fluids to prevent dehydration.

If you are concerned for any reason please seek medical advice
